The change to our new headmistress in Aceh seems promising. She is taken more seriously as she is local and not Javanese. This is partly due to Indonesia being an archipelago with very diverse cultures throughout the different islands. We also plan on sending the headmistress on a short trip to Java in order to observe another school so that she can utilize what she learns in running the school successfully in Aceh.

The funds have also been used to build a wall in Aceh. Around the school area there are many wild dogs that have already caused two deaths from rabies. It is for this reason, along with the cattle of local farmers that wonder in and destroy trees and property that we have started to build a wall around the perimeter of the school. Due to the substantial size of the perimeter of the school and lack of funds, we were only able to build half of the wall. We have placed a wire around the missing wall area. We hope to continue such construction work once we have enough funds.

As for our project in Serpong, it is still going strong and has now become very popular. However, this has created parking problems. This has led to several complaints from neighbors due to the increased amount of motorbikes parked next door. For organizational purposes and in order to keep the peace, we bought half an acre of land next to the school solely for this purpose.



In the summer, Charles and Oliver went to Indonesia. As usual they shared their time throughout the projects to give moral support, help with any physical work and made reports to ensure the smooth running of our projects and also for general feedback as we are always looking for ways to improve our work.
