2020 Report

During what has obviously been a harrowing year for everyone, the Hatch-Barnwell Trust continued to support the projects in Indonesia in exactly the same way as every other year, including funding. As it is acknowledged that the contribution that it makes to the many children in need, is hugely important.

Furthermore, the trust wishes to thank all of the valued staff and volunteers for their hard work and commitment to the projects.

2020 has been a tough year with the pandemic that hit everyone, which disrupted the projects hugely throughout the year in Indonesia.

The pandemic hit the vulnerable groups including children even harder than most. With the Indonesian Government imposing restrictions towards community activities during 2020, this has slowed down some of our planned projects unfortunately.

However, our charity was quick to adjust and continued assisting the many children in need where it was possible to do so, and we are pleased to report that the charity was able to continue its valuable work throughout the year.

Serpong

The Secondary school in Serpong is still struggling to attract more students, widely this year because of the pandemic. We hope in the future to overcome this and continue with our plans to enhance the school for our students.

This also impacted the Primary school, as children were forced to study from home this year.

The government decided to build a main road for access to another town, which was very close to the school. So the trust had no option but to construct a wall, in order to protect the children from ongoing traffic.

Due to the Coronavirus, building materials were very expensive, which hindered progress also.

Due to the extra funding required, progress was not as fast as we would have hoped, however we look forward to moving ahead with this project next year.

Aceh

Any further plans to provide another Secondary school were highly impacted by the pandemic, but as ever, we are hopeful that this situation will change in the future.

Padang

The pandemic hit Bu Farida very hard, as due to the lockdown she had to visit children at their homes, rather than them attending school. Many of the children did not have the facilities to enable them to home-school well. We sincerely hope this improves once the pandemic is more under control.

<u>Bali</u>

The situation in Bali was worse than other areas of Indonesia unfortunately as their livelihoods were affected by the lack of tourists in the year. The children help their parents by working after school to increase the family's income, which is driven by selling products to the tourists, and in a year where there were none, this

had obvious repercussions on the families of Bali. Where it becomes known that families are in desperate need, the trust donates food and money directly to them to help them.

Lombok

Despite the many challenges and restrictions faced in 2020, we are delighted to report that we have successfully completed our Rumah Sehat (medical clinic) project in Lombok. As you may recall our ambition in 2019 was to build an environment where our elderly and vulnerable could attend to seek medical attention. We are so pleased to have completed this project at the time that we did, because it provided the much-needed help for our vulnerable and elderly during the pandemic, which they would not have before.

Gunung Kidul

Even in such a challenging year, the children of Sulawesi were able to continue with their education and have food and shelter due to the fact that they were in a boarding school. In that regard, the welfare of the children was sustained so we are happy about that.
